This morning s hearing concerns regulations issued by the Department of Housing and Urban Development just prior to the November 1992 election affecting various aspects of the real estate industry under RESPA, the Real Estate Settlement Procedures Act. The regulations permitted certain activities including the pooling of computerized information about mortgage availability and, in some circumstances, remuneration for referrals to providers of settlement services. RESPA was first enacted by Congress in 1974 to protect consumers from unnecessarily high real estate settlement charges due to abusive practices. Among other things, RESPA prohibited
